The Medical University of Graz is a young university with a long-standing tradition: As early as 1863 much emphasis was laid on medical research



Education at the Medical University of Graz: practice-oriented education, small study groups, use of new media

and the education of new physicians, both of which proved to be very successful.

In January 2004, the former Faculty of Medicine was replaced by an autonomous university. The core competencies of the Medical University of Graz are high-standard training and education, research at an international level and continuous improvement of top-quality-medicine. Additionally, the orientation toward the bio-psycho-social model is one of the main concerns of the university.

Education of international reputation

According to the bio-psycho-social model patients with their ailment and environment take the center stage and specialists will come to them. But also in the field of education the Medical

University of Graz breaks new grounds because a new curriculum for medicine had been introduced in 2002. Students start their education with practical training and medical knowledge will be imparted in special modules. For the students this means practical experience at a very early stage of their studies, seminars and small study groups.

Furthermore, emphasis is laid on both medical knowledge and social competence and ethics. In the fall of 2004, the new study program „Nursing Science“ was introduced at the Medical University of Graz. It is the only regular one in Austria and accounts for all the new needs and challenges in health care.

Research at the Medical University of Graz – future technologies and high tech available today

The Medical University of Graz also focuses on research at an international level and on continuous improvement of top-quality-medicine and fundamental know-how.

Research at the Medical University of Graz at an international level means:

- ▶ 200 national and international projects with partners from both home and abroad as well as significant studies and publications
- ▶ state-of-the-art research infrastructure like the Center of Medical Research (ZMF), which opened in 2004 and offers a total area of 4,100m² for research. Apart from that there are numerous special labs,

- ▶ innovative technologies and committed researchers and scientific staff

Top-quality-medicine of international reputation

The Medical University of Graz and the University Hospital of Graz owe their international reputation as center for top-quality-medicine to substantiated training, to the perfect combination of education, research and top-quality-medicine and to the ongoing and intensive research works.

In order to ensure the head start in terms of knowledge and research results for the future, the Center for Medical Research (ZMF) had been realized within the framework of the project „LKH 2000“.

This program aims at enabling students to conduct research on their own responsibility in biomedical and clinical fields.



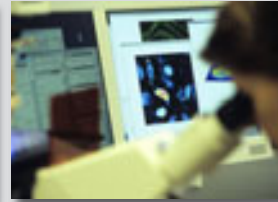
